Research Advisory Council May 22, 2023

<u>Chronic Teacher Shortages Continue</u> Districts Struggle to Find Qualified Teachers

Data from the annual Educator Shortage Survey conducted by the <u>Illinois Association of Regional Superintendents of Schools</u> indicate that the burden on public schools to find qualified teachers was significantly more challenging during Fall 2022 than in previous years. This has also been confirmed by data from the <u>Illinois State Board of Education</u>.

A major implication of teacher shortages is inequitable student access to high-quality teachers. Targeted strategies are greatly needed to bolster the supply of qualified teachers in areas with deep and persistent shortages. Illinois College-Going Survey Series How Illinois high school seniors decide on a 4-year college

Nearly half of Illinois high school seniors who go to four-year colleges choose to attend colleges out of state. Our latest report highlights key differences between students who chose to stay instate for college and those who leave for college. Students who attend colleges out of state are more likely to be White, from the suburbs or downstate, children of parents with high educational attainment levels, and feel very prepared for college. Our findings show that the top factors for leaving the state are tuition cost, perceived quality of colleges, social environment, and the importance of job placement after college. Students who attend colleges in the state are more likely to be Black or Latinx, from the city of Chicago, be children of parents with lower educational attainment levels, and feel less prepared for college. The main influence for attending colleges in the state was cost and location - staying close to home.
